

## Billiards Handicap Adjustment Table

Where a player in a billiards game has a handicap of –100 or more the following table is to be used to adjust the handicaps of both players in order to save time and prevent a late finish to the match.

For example, a player on a handicap of –170 would have a new handicap of –53. His opponent with a handicap of +60 would have a new handicap of +120 for the game.
